- CONFESSION OF SINS -

P. Blessed is the man who does not walk in the counsel of the wicked or stand in the way of sinners or sit in the seat of mockers.

**C. But his delight is in the law of the LORD,
and on His law he meditates day and night.**

P. He is like a tree planted by streams of water, which yields its fruit in season and whose leaf does not wither. Whatever he does prospers.

C. Not so the wicked! They are like chaff that the wind blows away.

P. Therefore the wicked will not stand in the judgment, nor sinners in the assembly of the righteous.

**C. For the LORD watches over the way of the righteous,
but the way of the wicked will perish.**

We are now holy and blameless before God and our worship is pleasing to Him.

Deuteronomy 26:1-11 - "And it shall be, when you come into the land which the LORD your God is giving you as an inheritance, and you possess it and dwell in it, that you shall take some of the first of all the produce of the ground, which you shall bring from your land that the LORD your God is giving you, and put it in a basket and go to the place where the LORD your God chooses to make His name abide. And you shall go to the one who is priest in those days, and say to him, 'I declare today to the LORD your God that I have come to the country which the LORD swore to our fathers to give us.' Then the priest shall take the basket out of your hand and set it down before the altar of the LORD your God. And you shall answer and say before the LORD your God: 'My father was a Syrian, about to perish, and he went down to Egypt and dwelt there, few in number; and there he became a nation, great, mighty, and populous. But the Egyptians mistreated us, afflicted us, and laid hard bondage on us. Then we cried out to the LORD God of our fathers, and the LORD heard our voice and looked on our affliction and our labor and our oppression. ' 20 "But God said to him, 'Fool! This night your soul will be required of you; then whose will those things be which you have provided?' 21 "So is he who lays up treasure for himself, and is not rich toward God." 22 Then He said to His disciples, "Therefore I say to you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat; nor about the body, what you will put on. 23 "Life is more than food, and the body is more than clothing. 24 "Consider the ravens, for they neither sow nor reap, which have neither storehouse nor barn; and God feeds them. Of how much more value are you than the

birds? 25 "And which of you by worrying can add one cubit to his stature? 26 "If you then are not able to do the least, why are you anxious for the rest? 27 "Consider the lilies, how they grow: they neither toil nor spin; and yet I say to you, even Solomon in all his glory was not arrayed like one of these. 28 "If then God so clothes the grass, which today is in the field and tomorrow is thrown into the oven, how much more will He clothe you, O you of little faith? 29 "And do not seek what you should eat or what you should drink, nor have an anxious mind. 30 "For all these things the nations of the world seek after, and your Father knows that you need these things. 31 "But seek the kingdom of God, and all these things shall be added to you.

- CONFESSION OF OUR FAITH -

(Martin Luther's Explanation of the First Article)

For all of which it is my duty to thank and praise, and to serve and obey Him.

A Devotion by Martin Luther on Harvest Thanksgiving:

*"The eyes of all wait upon thee;
and thou givest them their meat in due season."*

- Ps 145:15

We should learn here that God makes the wheat grow, and we should praise Him and give thanks to Him on that account. We should also recognize that it is not of our working but of His giving and blessing that wheat, and grapes, and all kinds of fruit grow, which we all need for food and drink. The Lord's Prayer proves this when we say: "Give us this day our daily bread." In the word "give" we confess that it is the gift of God and not our creation, and if He did not "give," not a grain would grow and our tilling would be in vain. ...For how soon might all the grain in the soil go bad, or be frozen, or rot, or be eaten by worms, or be drowned by floods! Or if it is growing well, how soon might it be destroyed by heat, or hail, or cold, or be eaten by beetles or other creatures! And who could count all the perils through which the wheat must pass before it is reaped, and even then it may be carried away, or devoured by worms? The devil would not let a single blade or leaf shoot and grow unless God held him in check.

Therefore, when we look at a field of wheat [or corn, or beans (njp)] we should not only think of God's goodness but also of His power and proceed to think: "O, you dear corn, how God, out of His rich and gentle goodness, gives you to us so plentifully, and also with what power He protects you, from the hour when you are sown to the time when you come to our table!..."

A devout and believing heart well perceives how all our ploughing and sowing and the like would be lost, unless God's goodness were here at work, and notwithstanding that we must do our work diligently and seek our food from the soil we must in now ay put our trust in our work as though our hands made the harvest. More is needed than our human hands. God's blessing is essential to growth, and also His mighty keeping.
